Murray Ridge School Teacher Receives Exceptional Service Award

On June 4, 2010, members of the Lorain County Board of Developmental Disabilities presented its Exceptional Service Award to Nick Kish, Teacher at Murray Ridge School. The award is given quarterly to an employee who, in the opinion of those nominating him or her, exceeds the already exceptional standards of service the agency aspires to. Nominations are only accepted from consumers, family members/guardians or community members.

Anna McElya, parent of a student at Murray Ridge School, nominated Kish saying "If there was a Teacher of the Year award, Nick should get it! I'd go and get the trophy myself! He has a fantastic imagination and beautiful way with the children. Everything he's done this year, the school play, the race, has been fantastic! I want to keep my son with Nick forever!"

A teacher at Murray Ridge School for six years, Kish has educated students in both intermediate and senior classes, and has dedicated himself to helping his students to become as independent as possible.

Joan Peterson, Murray Ridge School Supervisor, said Where others see obstacles, Mr. Kish sees opportunities for creative problem solving." Kish has initiated many unique programs at the school, including a recycling program which has raised money for non-verbal students to purchase communication devices when other funding was not available. He also established the "Pizza House," in which students sell pizza to staff one day a week for the same

purpose, as well as to practice social and communication skills in a functional manner. The "Work Crew" program, which he created, established school-wide jobs for which students had to apply and be interviewed. This volunteer vocational training program has not only given students experience with work in a variety of jobs, but has also taught them critical preemployment skills such as responding to job postings, completing applications, interviewing and completing job tasks.

Kish goes above and beyond in many other ways. He organized the first "Murray Ridge 500", a school-wide racing event so that students who utilize wheelchairs could actively compete in a relay activity just for them. He encouraged ambulatory students to participate as "pit crews" and fans. Every class in the school participated in this year's event, and parents and family friends attended as well.

And Kish's dedication is not limited by his job hours. He also volunteers many hours of his own time to support his students. When any of his students have been hospitalized, he and his classroom aide have gone after school hours to visit them, usually with a large get well card created by the class. For several years he has picked up students without transportation at their homes so they could attend the prom. "The highest compliment I can pay a teacher is to say, 'If my child was a student at Murray Ridge School, I would want you to be his teacher.' I can say that about Mr. Kish with 100% certainty," said Peterson.

Upon receiving the award, Kish said "This is such an honor to receive this award, but I have to say that I could never do any of the things I do by myself. All of these projects have taken a great effort on the part of many people at the school. Without their help, they would only be ideas."

Murray Ridge School Commencement 2010

On June 8, seven seniors graduated from the Murray Ridge School program. Rafael Bonet, Michael Fitzgerald, Mitchell Foster, Dan Glowaski, Isaac Hunt, Leonard McKinney and Princeton Perry began the transition from their childhood academic years into the adult world of work. Five of the seven graduates plan to attend one of the three Work/Activity Centers at Murray Ridge Center for vocational training.

Superintendent Amber Fisher encouraged the graduates to embrace their unique strengths and abilities and to grasp future opportunities that may enable them to reach their own greatest levels of independence and personal satisfaction. Following this message of pursuing one's own path and enjoying the journey of life, the Murray Ridge Choraleers gave a touching performance of Miley Cyrus' "The Climb." The Honorable Darrel A. Bilancini, Avon Lake Municipal Judge, then delivered the commencement address. Personalizing his remarks to each graduate individually, he highlighted the many unique gualities they each possessed according to their teachers, such as "charismatic," "life-loving" and "kind." "One of you has been described as 'kind.' If I could choose only one word in which to be described, it would be 'kind,' " said Judge Bilancini, and added "I aspire to be what you already are." He then wished the graduates well as they enter the next, exciting phase of their lives.

Following Judge Bilancini's address was the presentation of certificates by **Board President** Michelle L. Hunt and Board member Jane Spiegelberg, Ph. D. The Ninth Annual David Elsasser Spirit Award, which is given each year to a
